



Add some Native Bird-Friendly Plants to your garden and feed the birds! Each year, Golden Gate Audubon and CNPS Yerba Buena compile and promote a short list of native plants that are easily grown and readily available at local nurseries. These garden friendly plants can provide a feast for many beautiful bird species, with berries, seeds, nectar, and insects; they also support butterfly and moth larvae. This winter (the best time to plant is after fall's first heavy rain), ***we encourage you to support local nurseries through your purchase of locally native plants.*** Stop by one of the nurseries featured — your patronage will encourage them to stock even more locally native plants for birds. Best of all, when you add these plants to your garden, our local birds benefit!

- California Sagebrush | *Artemisia Californica*
- Thimbleberry | *Rubus parviflorus*

- Coyote Mint | *Monardella villosa*
- Yarrow | *Achillea millefolia*

- Beach Strawberry | *Fragaria chiloensis*
